

NCLEX Passing rate for 2020 was 92% and this rate has consistently been above the state and national averages.



DIRECT ADMIT TO THE SCHOOL OF NURSING

Direct admission to the School of Nursing is offered to High School Students with a 3.00 GPA and 22 ACT or a 1030 SAT. Seats in the direct admit to the School of Nursing Program are limited.

DIRECT ADMIT TO THE COLLEGE OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SCIENCES

Students who do not gain direct admission to the School of Nursing but have a high school GAP of 3.00 or above and a 22 ACT or 1030 SAT are offered direct admit to the College of Health and Human sciences.

UNIVERSITY ADMISSION: Students who do not meet the direct admission criteria at the time of application will be considered for University admission to take general education coursework their Freshman year. Students will be advised by an academic advisor within the college of their intended major.

NURSING PROGRAM ADMISSION CRITERIA

Students are admitted to the College of Health and Human Sciences to complete 32 credit hours of re-requisite courses.

Admission criteria:

Overall GPA 2.75

Pre-requisite Science Courses: Average GPA 2.75

- Human Anatomy I & II Lecture and Lab (2 semesters)
- General Organic and Biochemistry I & II Lecture and Lab (2 semesters)

Other Pre-requisite courses:

- Introduction to Psychology
- Statistics
- 2 Semesters of English
- Speech



THE APPLICATION PROCESS

Students are ready to apply:

- When all 32 pre-requisite courses are successfully completed.
- Applications are accepted during the spring semester
- After being accepted into the program, all students start the program in the fall semester.


