What is the 104-R?

- An academic 'roadmap' to help students graduate on time with a degree – and to commission
- Document used to map out a Cadet's academic progression
- Used to determine academic alignment
- Ensures Cadet will meet graduation requirements

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Who needs to fill out a 104-R?

- Cadets who are preparing to contract with ROTC
 - Contract: commit to completing ROTC in exchange for benefits
- New freshmen (scholarship winners)
- Freshmen, sophomores, juniors who are joining ROTC
- All contracted Cadets will need to update and revise their 104-R at least annually



Why is the 104-R Important?

- Agreement between Cadet and ROTC
- Determines number of semesters of benefits
- Allows ROTC to forecast graduation and commissioning
- ROTC instructor, ROO, HRT, and PMS all review 104-Rs each semester





How to fill out the 104-R

- Cadets must be full time students
- Cadets must take a military history class
 - Can be US Military History, Civil War, Vietnam War, Military Geography
 - Should at least have a placeholder
- Summer classes
 - Scholarship does not pay for summer classes (Engineering is exception)
 - Can take classes during summer except between junior – senior year
